

Program Notes

Fanfare and Fireworks

This piece was commissioned by the Parkland School District (Allentown, Pennsylvania) for their 5th Grade Combined Band and Orchestra. The music coveys the excitement and energy of a fireworks spectacular.

Castle Gate, 1924

The coal mining town of Castle Gate, Utah was established in the early 1800's. On March 8, 1924 a series of three explosions rocked the town, claiming the lives of over 170 people making it one of the worst mining disasters in the history of the United States.

The piece Castle Gate, 1924 tells the story of this disaster, and also reflects the legend left behind by the miners. The opening section includes three rumbles from the explosions (experienced from a distance). The piece quickly picks up into a haunting, yet adventurous theme with colorful sounds from the percussion section. Slowing down with a final declaration of the tragedy, the piece the picks back up to a faster tempo to close the story and memorialize the legend of the lost souls.

Valley Mist

A recent trip to West Virginia provided the composer with the inspiration for "Valley Mist". At dusk the valleys and low-lying areas slowly began to be covered by a cloud-like mist as if the heavens had come down to touch and encompass the earth. When viewed from the higher elevation of the mountainside the unfolding scene was one of serene beauty, as a river of mist seemed to flow around the base of the hills and mountains until the shadows of darkness encompassed all. This landscape, and the feeling of tranquillity and peace which it inspired is captured in "Valley Mist".

The Thunderer

Three years after Sousa was inducted into the Knights Templar of Washington, D.C., he dedicated this march to that organization. *The Thunderer* was Mrs. Sousa's favorite march and was chosen by Sousa as one of the five to be featured by his Great Lakes Naval Training Station Band on their tour in behalf of the American Red Cross during World War I.

Mystic Dance

This composition opens with a haunting flute melody accompanied by percussion consisting of finger cymbals, wind chimes, rain stick, conga drums, and more common instruments, the effect is at once mysterious and intriguing. An energetic theme eventually wins out and builds to an exciting conclusion.

Overture on a Hymn Tune

This composition is based on *The Old Ship of Zion* which is number 79 in the "Sacred Harp" songbook. AS with many old hymn tunes, it's origin is uncertain, but it is sometime attributed to Thomas W. Carter who lived in the mid 19th century. The overture features a typical fast-slow-fast format, with the middle section being rhapsodic in nature while still based loosely on the hymn tune.

Program Notes

The Lone Eagle March

"The Lone Eagle" was the nickname given to Charles Lindbergh after his successful solo flight across the Atlantic Ocean in his plane, *The Spirit of St. Louis*. This march is respectfully dedicated to his memory.

Project Mercury

Project Mercury was NASA's first manned space flight program. The project launched six manned missions between 1961 and 1963, establishing the foundation that eventually sent the first man to the moon.

The composition *Project Mercury* seeks to capture the spirit of Alan Shepard's landmark space flight. The piece begins with the blastoff of *Freedom* 7 and its ascent into the atmosphere. The percussion timbres and vocal effects in the winds depict the metallic sounds of the rocket gantry and the various gases used during liftoff. The music rises and falls both melodically and dynamically throughout the piece to portray the turbulent atmospheric currents during the ascent and reentry.

Grand Galop

This circus march, also called "circus gallop" and sometimes "screamer," is an American musical genre. Circuses were in need of music that would stir the audience into a frenzy, as four-footed animals galloped across the ring. Because march music was a prominent part of American music at the time, and because it carried such a quick tempo, it was this that the ringleaders demanded. Prominent composers of circus marches included Henry Fillmore and Karl L. King.
