



The Army Goes Rolling Along

The Army Goes Rolling Along is the official song of the United States Army and is typically called "The Army Song." The song is based on the "Caisson Song," written by field artillery First Lieutenant (later Brigadier General) Edmund L. Gruber, Lieutenant William Bryden, and Lieutenant (later Major General) Robert Danford while stationed at Fort Stotsenburg in the Phillipines in March 1908.

The tune quickly became popular in field artillery units. This exciting march is further embellished by the call of the bugle.

Shenandoah

Until the nineteenth century only adventurers who sought their fortunes as trappers and traders of beaver fur ventured as far west as the Missouri River. Most of these men were loners who became friendly with, and sometimes married, Native Americans.

Shenandoah is said to have originated with French voyageurs traveling down the Missouri River. The lyrics tell the story of a trader who fell in love with the daughter of an Algonquian chief, Shenandoah. American sailors heading down the Mississippi River picked up the song and made it a capstan shanty that they sang while hauling in the anchor.

The Yellow Rose of Texas

One of the iconic songs of modern Texas and a popular traditional American tune, *The Yellow Rose of Texas* has experienced several transformations of its lyrics and periodic revivals in popularity since its appearance in the 1850s. The earliest published lyrics to surface to date are found in Christy's Plantation Melodies. No. 2, a songbook published under the authority of Edwin P. Christy in Philadelphia in 1853.

Along Came the Cowboys

This concert work for band pays tribute to the great pioneer cowboys that "roughed it" while exploring the nation's last great frontier. From the band music of the era, the composer has incorporated three colorful melodies into this work: "Great Granddad," "I Ride An Old Paint," and "Red River Valley."

Program Notes

Americans We

Americans We was written by Henry Fillmore in 1929. It was played at every concert he conducted at the Cincinnati Zoo's Pure Food and Health Show because he realized it was one of his finest marches. At some concerts he announced it as "The Cincinnati Zoo" and on others as "Pure Food and Health." He settled on the title "Americans We" before publishing it on March 11, 1929. The dedication was "To all of us."

Heartland

This composition celebrates and honors America's pioneering spirit that permeates our lives and our souls. This uplifting attribute has been bestowed upon us because of brave and hardy men and women who formed Middle America from the fresh-water and topsoil that surrounds us still - our native land, to be maintained and cherished forever. For generations, our ancestors have passed along this spirit of adventure and deep-rooted integrity that remain the trademark characteristics of the people who hail from the middle of America: the Heartland.

Grand Canyon Suite

It is safe to say that Grofé's iconic work from the early 1930's remains his most recognized and programmed creation to this day. A master of instrumental color and texture, he is also credited with the brilliant orchestration of George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue," along with many popular standards and tunes from Broadway musicals of the time. For more than a decade, Grofé was the principal arranger of the Paul Whitman Orchestra.

The Oregon Trail

The Oregon Trail was the major route followed by American Pioneers as they moved westward during the 1840s. Some 12,000 brave men, women, and children set out on the six-month long, 2,000-mile journey that began near Independence, Missouri, and ended at the Columbia River region of Oregon.

Traveling on the Oregon Trail was a severe test of strength and endurance. Pioneers had to face flooded rivers, rugged mountain terrain, cholera and other serious diseases, Indian attacks, and a shortage of food and safe water. The sight of dead horses, oxen and numerous shallow graves of earlier pioneers was a constant reminder of the hardships yet to be faced.

Nevertheless, thousands made the courageous journey successfully and lived a prosperous new life in the great Northwest.

American Collage

American Collage includes five well-known patriotic themes. "America," "You're a Grad Old Flag," "The American Hymn," "America the Beautiful," and "The Stars and Stripes Forever" interspersed with short fragments of other popular American tunes.
